FAIR SHARE GIVING

In Overseas Combined Campaign

The once-a-year Overseas Combined Federal Campaign is underway here in behalf of the American Red Cross, 12 Health Agencies and nine American Overseas Agencies.

No dollar goal is established, but 100 per cent voluntary participation is an objective of the campaign. Another is to encourage use of a fair share giving guide in order to accomplish what a spokesman called "an enthusiastic and purposeful campaign."

"Contributors often ask how much they should give," he added, "but of course the decision to give and the amount is the sole responsibility of each donor."

A payroll deduction plan can be used at the option of the contributor. He will also receive an educational folder and a designation form. By designating, each donor can specify the groups or agencies he wants to support and the way he wants to divide his contribution among them.

The campaign runs through April 15.

Servicemen's Insurance: Soldier's Biggest Bargain

A soldier coming into the service is now automatically covered by insurance in amounts of \$5,000 or \$10,000; and it costs him only \$1 or \$2 per month.

All new soldiers are informed about the Servicemen's Group Life Insurance and are given the choice of declining if they wish.

However, if a person has declined coverage and later changes his mind, he must then take a physical examination and fill out an application form VA Form 29-8285.

Other Policies

The policy may be in addition to National Service Life Insurance or any U. S. Government life insurance which the soldier may have at the time.

The method of settlement is limited to a lump sum payment or a 36-month settlement in equal monthly instalments.

The soldier may designate any person as the beneficiary of his insurance policy.

When the person is discharged from the service, he is protected in the full amount for 120 days, the cost of which is covered by premiums paid during his active service.

Equal Amounts

The individual may then obtain an insurance policy without medical examination from any insurance company participating in the program. The amount, however, must be equal to his group insurance policy.

The Three "Cs" Of Defensive Driving

Concentration, Control, Courtesy

(EDITOR'S NOTE: Due to the extremely hazardous driving conditions in the Asmara area, the Provost Marshal's Office has been stressing DEFENSIVE DRIVING as the only method that will insure minimum accident risks. The Provost Marshal wants everyone to understand the three Cs of defensive driving: Concentration, Control and Courtesy. This article is the second in a series which deals with these basic rules to make your driving better, safer and accident free.)

CONTROL: It's In Your Hands

Control of the vehicle at all times is essential to defensive driving. Leading up to any accident is an interval of time in which the accident could have been prevented. This requires advance observation of conditions, sizing up situations, thinking ahead, so that you will have a solution ready and thereby control the car, while there is still time to avoid an accident.

The smooth operation of a vehicle is necessary for proper control. Contributing requirements for safe, smooth driving are:

* A properly maintained vehicle in good mechanical condition, one that can be controlled with confidence by the driver who recognizes that the well designed and maintained vehicle will not

within itself, prevent accidents. To say that a vehicle is under control, means it is in safe condition and will perform the way you want it to in any situation.

* The good physical and emotional health of drivers. Visual, physical and mental fatigue or disabilities affect the split-second timing reactions needed when an emergency arises.

* To drive at speed beyond safe control for existing traffic or road conditions is courting and wooing danger. It may be all right to keep up with the Joneses, but to pass them going 80 miles per hour could be costly or deadly.

Ice and snow, wet streets, railway tracks, high water, mud and strong winds require an adjustment of speed and a little thoughtful effort to maintain control of the vehicle.

To help us understand the factors necessary for control, engineers and scientists have given us many facts that must be taken into consideration when determining split-second timing of reaction and braking distances. To determine the braking distance, they analyze the types and conditions of road surfaces and compute the effect of traction, friction, energy of motion, gravity and centrifugal force, all of which we should know something about, if we expect to become safe defensive drivers.
